Important School Information

Parent/Teacher Conferences

Due to the large number of students in grades 3 & 4, it will be necessary for the classroom teacher to assign scheduled conference times. If a conference is scheduled for your child, you will receive communication from the teacher regarding the time and date.

Cancellation/Delay of School/One Call

In the event of inclement weather (**SNOW, FOG, ICE**) the Greenville City Schools will be using the One Call Now Parent Broadcast System to inform parents of delays, closing, or early releases. Information may also be obtained on TV stations 2, 7, 8, and 22 or at the school website listed below. Local radio station WTGR 97.5 (TIGER) will also broadcast all closing or delay information. **School could be delayed between one and three hours for weather conditions.** In the event of a three hour delay, the school day will be extended an hour. East School will begin at 11:55 am and end at 4:35 pm. Lunch will be served to the students shortly after arrival. **Parents can now add or update contact information to be used on the One Call Now Parent Broadcast at the school district's website at www.greenville.k12.oh.us.**

Asbestos Management Program—Annual Notice

An October 22, 1986, President Reagan signed the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA, Public Law 99-519). The act required the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to develop regulations for addressing asbestos in public and private elementary and secondary schools. On October 30, 1987, the EPA published the Asbestos-Containing Materials in Schools Rule (40 CFR Part 763 Subpart E). This rule stipulated, and our district has complied with, the following key requirements:

Identification of asbestos-containing materials in all school buildings.

Development and implementation of asbestos management plans for each school.

Regular surveillance and re-inspections of the condition of asbestos in the buildings.

Designation and training of a person to oversee asbestos activities within the district and to ensure compliance with the regulations.

This memorandum is to advise you that asbestos management plans for the district schools were developed following the EPA ruling and subsequently approved by the State of Ohio, Department of Health. These plans are regularly updated and are available for you to review.

Should you have any questions regarding this program or would like to review an asbestos management plan, please contact the Board of Education offices during normal business hours.

Collection of Student Fees and Fine

All school fees are to be paid in full by the end of the first nine week grading period. Participation in school-sponsored activities, groups, or organizations deemed as an extra privilege and not directly related to formal assessment for an academic course, including but not limited to: interscholastic athletic programs, clubs, instrumental music programs, vocal music programs, field trips, **Field Day, Character Dance, Character Carnival**, and any other programs outside the regular school day will not be permitted until all fees and fines for that student have been paid in full unless the student is on an approved payment plan. An approved payment plan is as follows: Activities with duration of one week or more - 50% of total fees owed will be due prior to participation in the activity and 100% of total fees owed paid by mid-point of the activity duration.

Student Surveys

Annually, the Board must provide reasonable notice to parents that their child may be involved in Board approved third party surveys. The school must also give the parents the opportunity to opt their child out of the activity.

Parents have a right to inspect a survey created by a third party before that survey is administered by the school to students. Parents will be notified by the school when a survey is to be administered and will have at least two weeks to review the materials.

If the parents do not want their children to be a participant in the survey they must notify the school.

Notes From the Nurse

As the cold and flu season is rapidly approaching, it is necessary to discuss the use of cough drops at school. Students will be permitted to bring only enough cough drops for one week. Also, your child should not attend school until he/she has been fever free for twenty-four hours without medication to control the fever.
