Bonjour! Today we celebrate the fourth day of National French week. So far this week we have learned about the French language and its role in the world. The French-speaking country that everyone is familiar with is France! In 2013, Over 85.7 million people visited France making it the world's most popular tourist destination! The most popular place to visit is The Eiffel Tower – the symbol of Paris and one of the most famous landmarks in the entire world - with over 7 million visitors per year. In fact, the Eiffel Tower just celebrated its 300 millionth visit this past September. This feat of ingenuity is a structure of 8,000 metallic parts, designed by Gustave Eiffel as a temporary exhibit for the World's Fair of 1889. Originally hated by critics, the 1000 foot-high tower is now a beloved and irreplaceable fixture of the Paris skyline. The structure's unique gracefulness has earned it the nickname of "Iron Lady." Visitors are impressed by the tower's monumental size and the breathtaking panoramas at each of the three levels. Tourists can dine with a view at the first level or indulge at the world-renowned restaurant on the second level. At the exhilarating height of 900 feet, the top level offers a sweeping outlook over the city of Paris and beyond - extending as far as 45 miles on a clear day. Tomorrow, the French classes encourage you to join with us as we finish our National French week by wearing bleu, blanc, et rouge! (Blue, White, and Red – the colors of the French flag!)
