September Learning Expectations*

Start Smart Unit: Big Idea: How can a challenge bring out our best?

Week 1: Essential Question (EQ): What discoveries can people make when they cooperate with others?

Topics: close reading, folktales, rhyme scheme, collaborative conversations, writing about reading

Week 2: EQ: What can you discover by observing nature?

Topics: close reading of informational text, fluency, inferences, text features, write to text – genre writing

Unit 1: Big Idea: How can a challenge bring out our best?

Week 1, Clever Ideas: EQ: Where do good ideas come from?

Topics: genre – fairy tales, comprehension – make predications, context clues – synonyms, sequence, narrative text– ideas, sentences, fluency – intonation, inflectional endings

Week 2, Think of Others: EQ: How do your actions affect others?

Topics: genre – realistic fiction, make predications, problem and solutions, writing – narrative texts– ideas, subjects and predicates, inflectional endings, fluency – expression and rate

* By the end of each week your child should be able to explain and give examples of the topics and work.

Classroom Tidbits

- ♦ Take Home Folders should be returned to school every day in your child's backpack. The folders are the main mode of communication between the classroom and the parent. Be sure to discuss items with your child.
- Assignment/Agenda
 Book should be returned to school every day. Your child is responsible for writing their homework assignments in the agenda every day there is assigned homework.
- Talk with your child daily about their work in the classroom and about the books we have been reading.

Classroom Information

Grade 3 & 4 Homework Policy: Homework is due at the beginning of class. Students will be afforded one late pass for language arts, mathematics, and science/social studies per quarter. Late work will be accepted the following day when using the pass. Credit will not be issued for late work beyond the day extension (when using the homework pass).

Reading Log: Students are to read a **minimum** of 30 minutes five days per week. They will have a reading log to complete weekly. These logs are given to the student on Monday and are due the following Monday. Please be sure to sign/initial your child's log each day or they will not receive credit for reading that day.

Spelling: Spelling words should be practiced daily with one the strategies that will be taught in class and explained at a later date.

Scholastic News: Your child will be receiving this news magazine most weeks.

iPads and eSpark – More information will be coming home. The students will be using their iPad everyday at school.

Growth Mindset – Periodically we will be participating in growth mindset activities to discover how our brain learns, that challenges grow our brains, how productive struggles help us to learn, and success skills such as grit, perseverance, power of yet, and character.
