That the Board of Education will fully cooperate with the necessary documents needed to fulfill the request for funding, including but not limited to: 1) completion of the Community Grant Initial Submittal Form and the provision of an appropriate insurance certificate. 2. WHEREAS, the Greenville City School District (the "School District"), County of Darke, Ohio is undertaking its Ohio School Facilities Commission Classroom Project (and locally funded initiatives), which includes a new K-8 elementary/middle school and locally funded initiatives (collectively, the "Project");

WHEREAS, the School District Board of Education (the "Board of Education") entered into a Project Agreement (the "Project Agreement") with the Ohio Facilities Construction Commission/Ohio School Facilities Commission (the "Commission") for the Project;

WHEREAS, the Board of Education, with the approval of the Commission, has contracted with a qualified professional design firm, Garmann/Miller & Associates, Inc. (the "Architect"), under Sections 153.65 to 153.71, ORC, to prepare plans, specifications and estimates of cost, and such data as the Board of Education and Commission deem necessary for the Project in compliance with the Project Agreement, and Section 3318.091, ORC;

WHEREAS, the Commission has provided a budget for the Project and said budget has been reviewed by Architect and total budget was included in the Project Agreement;

WHEREAS, the Architect has compiled, dated and signed a program of requirements for the Project which determined the scope of the Project, and the Board of Education approved the design phase related to the program of requirements; and

WHEREAS, the Architect has submitted the provisional design development documents to the School District, Shook Touchstone IX, LLC (the "CMR"), who is the construction manager at risk by qualifications-based selection, and Gilbane Building Company (the "Owner-Agent"), the owner-agent for the Project, and the Commission, and each reviewed an estimate of the construction cost referred to as the "Design Development Phase Estimate", and the parties have reviewed and commented on the provisional design development documents;

WHEREAS, the School District now desires to approve the design development stage submission, which includes the Design Development Phase Estimate.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Education, that after careful consideration and evaluation of the information before it that:

Section 1. Based upon the recommendations of the Architect, CMR, and Owner Agent, this Board of Education approves the design development stage submission for the Project in the form on file with this Board of Education, subject to the Commission's final review, comment and consent. Failure of the Commission to grant its consent shall cause the Board of Education's approval of said design development stage submission for the Project to become null and void. The Board of Education authorizes the School District officials it has heretofore designated as Authorized Representatives to take such further actions as are necessary in connection with the foregoing approval, including signature for and on behalf of the School District of a design review acceptance form related to the design development stage submission and any forms and instruments related to LFIs. The hard cost estimate at the design development phase submission is \$42,095,514 (includes revisions, alternates and value engineering items), which is \$116,231 below the hard cost budget of \$42,211,745.

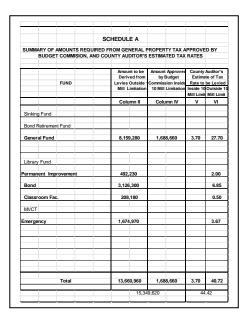

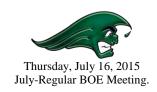

WHEREAS, the Greenville City School District ("School District"), County of Darke, Ohio, entered into a Project Agreement with the Ohio Facilities Construction Commission/Ohio School Facilities Commission (the "OSFC") consisting of a K-8 Building and locally funded initiatives (collectively, the "Project");

WHEREAS, the Board of Education entered into an agreement called "Architect/Engineer Agreement Form (OSFC Project) State of Ohio Professional Services Agreements for Public Facility Construction" (the "Original Architect Agreement") with Garmann/Miller & Associates, Inc. (the "Architect") for the Project;

WHEREAS, in connection with certain additional square footage added to the initial Project scope, which is a locally funded initiative, the Architect has submitted a proposed Amendment #1 Architect/Engineer Amendment Form to the Original Architect Agreement (the "Amendment #1 to Architect Agreement") providing for additional architect/engineering services for that additional square footage together with compensation to the Architect therefor in an amount not to exceed \$48,561.00;

WHEREAS, the School District and the OSFC officials recommend that the Board of Education approve the Amendment #1 to Architect Agreement in the amount of \$48,561.00 and authorize the execution of the Amendment #1 to Architect Agreement to the CMR Agreement for that purpose;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that after careful consideration and evaluation of the information before it:

Section 1. Upon the recommendation of the School District and OSFC officials, the Board of Education hereby approves the Amendment #1 to Architect Agreement in the form presently on file with this Board, subject to the approval by the OSFC. The President and Treasurer, on behalf of the Board of Education, are hereby authorized and directed to execute and sign the Amendment #1 to Architect Agreement in substantially the form presently on file with this Board with such changes not substantially adverse to the Board of Education as the official executing the same may approve, with their execution being conclusive evidence that the changes are not substantially adverse to the Board of Education. If the OSFC does not approve Amendment #1 to Architect Agreement, this authorization shall be null and void.

Section 2. WHEREAS, Ohio's schools have traditionally been governed by an elected board of education, the members of which have been chosen by their fellow community members to make sound decisions concerning the education of the community's children and to determine the most effective use of local tax dollars in pursuit of that goal; and

WHEREAS, the 2010 appointment of an academic distress commission in the Youngstown City Schools and the recent restructuring of that commission to function under a CEO appointment by individuals who may reside outside the Youngstown community - as opposed to being named by those who best know that community - has set aside the ability of the elected board of education to exercise its governing authority; and

WHEREAS, those restructuring changes were contained in a last-minute amendment to House Bill 70, which the Ohio General Assembly passed without any serious input from the Youngstown City Board of Education or Youngstown community; and

WHEREAS, the adoption of this amendment was completed by Columbus-based legislators with little or no connection to the Youngstown community and without any genuine effort to engage those most affected by the action; and

WHEREAS, this legislation lays the groundwork for the same restructuring changes to take place in other districts across the state

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that we, the Greenville City Schools Board of Education, representing the children they serve, do object and protest the manner in which this Draconian legislation was passed and question how the district reforms and improvements can be achieved without involving and engaging the elected board of education and the Youngstown community; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that we ask the Superintendent of Public Instruction, as the manager of the academic distress commission process, to take appropriate steps to engage the elected board of education and community in the school improvement process prior to appointment of the new CEO; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that we implore members of the Ohio General Assembly, the State Board of Education, an Governor John R. Kasich to seek amendments to House Bill 70 and the academic distress commission procedures that will preserve and enhance democracy and local control; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that such amendments should embrace the original intent House Bill 70's to foster community engagement and collaboration to create community learning centers that will better serve Youngstown's children and families; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all Ohio boards of education adopt this resolution and forward said resolution to the governor, the members of the Ohio General Assembly, the State Board of Education and the state superintendent of public instruction.
