# Learning Targets for May

### Reading

The month of May brings review!
Students will be spiraling through various genres and reading skills they have learned throughout the year.
They will review through reading and analyzing texts, and also with playing games. Games are a great way to assess students' understanding and gives me the opportunity to intervene or extend learning opportunities as needed.

As we review, we will:

- Analyze how characters' traits and their motivations, feelings, and actions can affect the plot of a story.
- Summarize to identify a theme and supporting evidence.

### Writing

In May, students will write narratives. A narrative is a story that shares a sequence of events, characters, and themes. Students will write narratives with a clear beginning, middle, and end, along with the paragraph-writing elements they have learned throughout the year. Also, students will use our strategy – C.U.P.S.:

- C Capitalize appropriately
- U Understand (Does the writing make sense? Can the audience understand what you have written?)
- P Punctuation
- S Spelling
