## Reading and Writing

This month, we will be exploring a variety of fiction and nonfiction texts. With the **nonfiction texts**, we will build our skills in:

- Answering questions using the text for support.
- Determining the main idea and key details that support it.
- Using text features to better understand information presented by an author.
- Understanding an author's point of view compared to our own.

As we read fictional pieces, we will:

- Identify figurative language and how it adds meaning to a text.
- Analyze how characters' motivations, feelings, and actions can affect the sequence of events in a story.

For writing, students will continue to build skills in paragraph writing in which they respond to a prompt. Student will practice using text evidence from a given passage to support their paragraph response.

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
