Kindergarten News from Miss Rinderle

Continue to practice the sight words, complete the homework each night and read for the reading log!

We have read a few sight word books in the classroom, including: "I Can Read: I," "I Can Read: a," "I Can Read: can," and "I Can Read: see." When we read a new book in the classroom, your child should be bringing it home that night to read to you. After your child has read the book to you, please send it back to school so your child can put it into their bookbin. I also remind the students to pick out a different sight word book to bring home the next night. Books can be read and recorded more than once on the reading log. We also read books/make books throughout the school day and on our letters that we are learning about each week. Some examples are the little letter books. These books can be read for the reading log, but can then be kept at home. Usually, if the pictures in the book are colored, then it can be kept at home. You will begin to see leveled readers and/or nursery rhyme books this month too! These will be the books with the colored edge and will need to be returned to school after your child has read you the book. For the October reading log, the books need to be ones that your child is doing most of the reading. I would still encourage you to read to your child, but your child should also be reading to you.

Remember to check your child's folder each night, to take all work out of the "Keep at Home" side of the folder and to check the behavior chart to see how his or her day went.

Please make sure that you are dressing your child for the weather and to practice zipping jackets if your child is not able to do this skill by him/herself.
