Targeted Activities

- REAP (Re-Entering as Parents) Grandparents raising, or significantly
 influencing their grandchildren have access
 to group meetings and other support
 activities. Participating grandparents and
 community members are family helpers for
 others providing respite, tutoring, and
 mentoring.
- SharEd (School Hotline to Acquire Resources and Education) - A statewide call-in question and answer line for parents or professionals to get up-to-date local, state, and federal information. This includes information about best practices, changes in laws, new guidelines, and current educational topics.
- Social Service Referral Network A support service where families needing assistance can call and receive information about social service programs and support. Referrals are made to organizations with specific expertise rather than Ohio PIRC attempting to meet all needs.
- WORK (Work Opportunities Resources and Knowledge) - Parent and/or grandparent volunteers receive on-site work coaching, training, experience, and support by volunteering in the Ohio PIRC office.

- Parent to Parent/Child to Child An ongoing parent education group for parents to learn about their children's education. Children participate in a parallel group with related topics. Target population is school-age but is open to all.
- Parents As Teachers A voluntary, open access program for families based on the belief that parents are their children's first and most influential teachers. This program offers home visits to discuss child development and child rearing issues, group meetings, and periodic development and health screenings.
- Empowering Parents and Communities A training curriculum designed to enable parents and/or caregivers to increase their involvement in their communities and sharpen their skills for effective leadership. EPC promotes the development of parents and caregivers to understand the needs of children and the issues that challenge parents as well as other community members.

Educational Program

Individual Consultation

- Consults with parents about the education of their children.
- Helps parents and schools mediate problems.
- Facilitates the development of students' education programs.
- Provides information about educational topics.
- Refers parents and schools to appropriate service providers.

Training

- Assists schools and families in setting up educational programs.
- Develops, implements, and delivers training to parents, schools, and organizations based on their needs.


