Student Wellness and Success & Disadvantage Pupil Impact Aid Spending Plan

Ohio Revised Code and the State Budget Bill provides Greenville City Schools with funding to help support students' academic achievement through mental health counseling, wraparound services, mentoring and after-school programs. To help ensure that these dollars make the greatest impact on the students of Greenville City Schools, the district has partnered with Recovery & Wellness Centers of Midwest Ohio and Council on Rural Services. Cynthia Wion, as representative of Recovery & Wellness, and Jeff Vaughn, as representative of Council on Rural Services, will offer input and suggestions on ways that the district can use these funds to increase the effect on the students and community.

In partnership, we have discussed, developed and began implementing a number of ways to help increase the overall health, well-being, and safety of our student population. The services that were implemented for the 2023-2024 school year, and will continue into the 2024-2025 school year and beyond, include, but are not limited to, the following:

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




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
